Holy Martyrs Acindynus and Pegasius

They suffered for Christ in Persia during the reign of Shapur II in about the year 345. Sts. Acindynus, Pegasius and Anempodistus served at the imperial court. After various and horrible torments they were burnt. St. Afton, a warrior, and Elpidephorus, the imperial grandee, who criticized the Shah for the innocent persecution of Christians, were beheaded. Together with these Holy Martyrs up to 7000 Christians were beheaded.
